- Know how the Romans, Vikings and Anglo Saxons invaded Britain.



Key vocabulary:

Invaders: People who invade and attack other people's land.

Settlers: People who own the land under attack..

Celts: a group of people who belong to a tribe. Celts lived in Britain and Ireland from 750BC to 43AD.

Romans: The Romans were a people founded in mainland Europe within the area now known as Italy. They got much of their wealth by conquering other lands. They invaded Britain in 55BC.

Vikings: People from Scandinavia who first invaded Britain in 793AD.

Anglo Saxons: Groups of people from northern Europe who arrived and settled in Britain from the 5th Century.

Raid: to suddenly attack a place without warning.

Longships: A long narrow warship used by the Vikings to travel around Scandinavia and to other countries including Britain.

Navigate: plan and direct the direction of travel of a ship or boat.
