Apps and their age limits

Before making the decision to allow your child access to social media, please be aware of the age restrictions of the different apps. Should you consider your child responsible enough to act appropriately on any of the apps, please find below a guide as to how to set up parental controls so you remain in control and aware of how your child is using their accounts.

TikTok Family Pairing

Family Pairing on TikTok allows parents to customise their safety settings based on individual needs. A parent can link their TikTok account to their child's and set parental controls including: deciding how long your child can spend on TikTok each day, get a summary of your child's time spent on TikTok, decide when to mute your child's push notifications, select keywords or hashtags to exclude from your child's 'For You' and 'Following feeds', restrict your child's exposure to content that may not be appropriate, restrict who can send messages to your child, or turn off direct messaging completely.

How to set up Family Pairing

- To link parent and teen accounts:
- 1. In the TikTok app, tap Profile at the bottom.
- Tap the Menu button at the top.
- 3. Tap Settings and privacy, then tap Family Pairing.
- 4. Tap Parent or Teen.
- 5. Follow the steps in the app to link accounts.
- How to manage Family Pairing controls
- To manage or view Family Pairing controls:
- In the TikTok app, tap Profile at the bottom.
- Tap the Menu button at the top.
- 3. Tap Settings and privacy, then tap Family Pairing.
- 4. Select the account you want to manage.
- 5. Update the controls, as needed.

Snapchat Parental Controls

Snapchat's Family Centre is a set of parental controls that helps you see who your child is communicating with on Snapchat and set Content Controls. Family Centre reflects the dynamics of real-world relationships between parents and children, where parents have insight into who their child is spending time with. On Family Centre, parents can also easily and confidentially report any concerns directly to Snapchat's Trust and Safety team.

How to set up Family Centre

- 1. Open the app and tap 'Sign Up' to create an account.
- 2. Ask your child for their username, so you can add them as a friend.

Once you have their username, you can search for it using the search bar at the Camera screen's top-left corner.

3. Once your child has accepted your friend request, you'll be ready to get started with Family Centre.

4. To access family centre, go to Settings (gear icon), located at the top-right corner of your Profile Page (located at the top left corner across all tabs), where Family Centre has a permanent home.

5. Once you open Family Centre, you'll need to invite your child to join. Your child will receive an invitation card, and they must opt in to participate.

- 6. Your child needs to tap 'Accept', and you'll both be notified that the status of the invitation has been updated.
- 7. Now, you can use Family Centre to see who your child is talking to and set Content Controls.

Whatsapp parental controls

Whatsapp does not have parental control settings so please ensure your child's privacy settings are set appropriately.

Parental control app recommended by the Police – Qustodio

Qustodio Parental Control App makes parenting easier with screen time limits, games and app monitoring, app blocking, location tracking and the most advanced reporting. Start by downloading this Qustodio Parental Control App onto your device. Then download the Kids App Qustodio companion app onto your child's device or devices. The two monitoring apps work together to give parents all the tools they need to protect their kids online and encourage a healthy, balanced digital presence.
