## Attendance meeting - important information

#### School starts at 8:45am



Children arriving between 9 – 9:30am will receive a Late mark (L Code)

Children arriving after 9:30am will receive an Unauthorised Absence (U Code) which affects their overall attendance

If you need to report your child absent from school, **you must contact the office via phone call before 8:45am** on the first day of absence, and each subsequent day.

If your child is absent and school have not received any contact from you, you will receive a text message, phone call and a visit to your home address may take place.

This is part of school's safeguarding procedures, to ensure that all pupils are safe and well.

We understand that children pick up sickness bugs and illnesses which result in them being absent from school.

In most cases, these absences will be authorised

(I code)

However, if we feel that a child has been absent from school regularly because of illness, we may ask for medical evidence.

#### This could be:

- An appointment card
- A prescription
- A photograph of prescribed medication
- A text message or email from your GP surgery, confirming an appointment

If your child has a minor illness such as a cough or runny nose, you can still send them into school. If they get worse throughout the day, school will contact parents.

School staff will administer medication such as paracetamol, antihistamines or prescribed medication.

In very exceptional circumstances, such as a bereavement or funeral, a pupil's absence from school may be authorised.

However, this will only be for a short period (usually 1 day) and must be agreed by the headteacher.

# School cannot authorise absence for holidays during term time.

A holiday during term time will result in a Penalty Notice being issued by the Local Authority.

First occasion - £80 per parent per child Second occasion - £160 per parent per child Any further occasions – PACE or Prosecution

Schools do not benefit financially from fines issued by Manchester City Council.



#### 'Initial Concern' letter

If school become concerned with your child's attendance, you will receive a letter informing you that their attendance has fallen and needs to improve within a given timescale.

Within this letter, you will be reminded of the school's attendance procedures and that there is support available should you need it.



#### Invite to meeting

If your child's attendance does not improve following the letter, you will be invited into school for a meeting to discuss this in more detail.

We will talk about any issues you or your child may be facing, any barriers to them attending school, and support will be offered.

Parents/Carers are asked to agree to Attendance Goals which will be put in place at the meeting, with the aim of improving the child's attendance within a given timescale.



#### Notice to Improve

If parents/carers do not attend the Attendance Meeting, or where there is a lack of engagement in the support and plans that are in place, the Local Authority may issue a Notice to Improve letter.

This outlines the legal expectations of parents in ensuring their child attends school regularly, and will also outline the next stages of intervention, such as a Fixed Penalty Notice.
