Key Changes to Our School Calendar

After careful consideration and listening to feedback from our school community, we have made the following adjustments:

October Half Term

- Two INSET days will be added to the October half term break
- This will create a longer autumn break for families

May Half Term

- Extended to two full weeks
- Providing another excellent opportunity for family time

Summer Term

• School will finish one week later in July

• Last day of term: Friday 24th July

- Better value family holidays avoiding peak season prices

Important Changes to HAF Club

Our HAF club will be running for the first 4 weeks of the summer holidays. Please note, due to changes with funding, we can only take 40 children and those children who are eligible for free school meals, will be prioritised.

In previous holidays, you have been advised that you can turn up on the day to be booked in. This is no longer the case. Please do not do this, as you will be turned away. If you haven't booked via the portal, you do not have a place.

The portal will go live on **Monday 16th June**, so if your child is eligible for free school meals, please book their place as quickly as possible, as it is not just the children of Newall Green Primary School who can book these spaces.

If you do not manage to secure a space for your child, you can still book them on through school spider but there will be a charge of £20 per day. Further to this, as always, if your child is under the age of 5 or not entitled to free school meals, you can also book on School Spider at a cost of £20 per day.
