#### **Rights Champions and School Council**

Last week, we had a joint committee meeting for the Rights Champions and School Council. #### **New Trim Trail**

We are incredibly proud to have opened our new trim trail for the KS2 playground. At the start of the year, the School Council created an action plan for the year and listened to the voices of the young people in our school so improving the KS2 playground became their focus.

The School Council have worked so hard all year to raise the money to improve the playground. They filmed videos, made posters, litter picked wearing QR codes, wrote incredibly persuasive letters and presented to groups of business leaders all of which helped us to secure the £10,000 from BUPA. They also spent their break times, afternoons and stayed after school to sell raffle tickets and do cake sales to raise a further £869. This money has been spent on the trim trail and we have also purchased lots of new toys and games for the playground which the children have enjoyed using.

Manchester Airport has since kindly donated £1,000 so we have placed an order for a new piece of equipment to be added to the trim trail ready for next school year. We cannot put into words how incredibly proud we are of our School Council for their advocacy, determination and enthusiasm.

We would also like to celebrate a wonderful group of wonderful year 5 students who have been responsible all year for putting out and collecting the lunch equipment every day. They have done a wonderful job of keeping the equipment organised and tidy and this makes a massive difference to the lifespan of the activities so thank you for all of your hard work.

We hope that all of the children will enjoy the new equipment safely and treat it respectfully so that it will last for years to come.

Just a reminder to parents and carers that we ask children not to use the trim trail unless supervised by an adult during break and lunch time.

# Important Notice

Following careful consideration of current UK legislation and safety requirements, we have implemented a <u>complete ban</u> on e-scooters across our school premises. This decision has been made to ensure we maintain the highest standards of safety for all our children and comply with legal obligations.

Under current UK law, privately owned e-scooters are prohibited from use on public roads, pavements, cycle lanes, and pedestrian areas.

Beyond the legal requirements, we have significant safety concerns regarding e-scooters. These include potential accidents and trip hazards for our children and staff. As a school, we must prioritise the wellbeing of everyone, especially in light of the recent tragic death of a young man in Wythenshawe.

As of today, we ask that you **DO NOT** bring any E-Scooters on to the school premises, as you will be asked to leave. We are no longer allowing them to be walked through the school grounds.

I appreciate your understanding and cooperation in this matter. Together, we can maintain a safe and secure environment where our children can learn and thrive.
