We understand that this may cause some inconvenience for families and we sincerely appreciate your support and understanding. The decision to schedule the training on the last day of term was made to minimise disruption to learning while still fulfilling our responsibility to provide high quality care and safety standards.

Igo card applications and summer drop-in sessions

If you're 11-16 years old, you'll need an <u>igo card</u> to travel using child tickets on buses and trams in Greater Manchester. It can take up to two weeks to process your igo card application, so make sure you apply in plenty of time for the start of the new term.

The Bee Network team is hand to help at five pop-up stalls at <u>interchanges</u> across Greater Manchester this summer. Simply drop by between 10am – 2pm to speak to staff and get your application in early:

- Tuesday 29 July: Bolton Interchange
- Tuesday 5 August: Bury Interchange
- Tuesday 12 August: Shudehill Interchange
- Tuesday 19 August: Stockport Interchange
- Tuesday 26 August: Altrincham Interchange

Make sure you bring:

- A passport-sized colour photo of the child that's applying.
- Proof of name and age of the child applying: a copy of your birth certificate, adoption certificate, medical card, passport or EU/EEA card. Please do not bring original documents.
- Payment (for the £10 fee).

Important Notice

Following careful consideration of current UK legislation and safety requirements, we have implemented a <u>complete ban</u> on e-scooters across our school premises. This decision has been made to ensure we maintain the highest standards of safety for all our children and comply with legal obligations.

Under current UK law, privately owned e-scooters are prohibited from use on public roads, pavements, cycle lanes, and pedestrian areas.

Beyond the legal requirements, we have significant safety concerns regarding e-scooters. These include potential accidents and trip hazards for our children and staff. As a school, we must prioritise the wellbeing of everyone, especially in light of the recent tragic death of a young man in Wythenshawe.

As of today, we ask that you **DO NOT** bring any E-Scooters on to the school premises, as you will be asked to leave. We are no longer allowing them to be walked through the school grounds.

I appreciate your understanding and cooperation in this matter. Together, we can maintain a safe and secure environment where our children can learn and thrive.
