Autumn 1 Knowledge Organiser

In Nursery we learn indoors and outdoors.

In phonics we would like your child to be able to:

- Recognise their own name
- Look at books independently, handling books carefully.
- Hold books the correct way up and turns pages one at a time.
- Talk about the pictures in books
- Talk about how the story might end.
- Talk about what happened in the beginning, middle or end of the story.
- Know that the writing in a book means something.
- Know that in English that writing is read from left to right and top to bottom.
- Talk about WHERE the story takes place and WHO is in the story.
- Talk about the writing they see when you're about and about.

In literacy we would like your child to be able to:

- > Talk about their favourite stories.
- > Sing their favourite rhymes and songs.
- Repeats words or phrases in their favourite stories eg Run, run as fast as you can etc.
- > Fill in missing words or phrases in a known rhyme or story.

In maths we would like your child to be able to:

- Give you a small number of objects from a group, for example, 'please give me one', 'please give me two'.
- Count numbers in order to 10, 15 or beyond.
- Say which teddy is big or little, which pile of toys is big or little.
- Say which pile of fruit has 'more' and 'a lot'.
- Know that if you add or take away objects from a pile they can see that the pile of objects has changed.
- Begin to make marks on paper that might look like numbers
